Our community has never been stronger and our mission never more urgent. Students continue to recover from the pandemic, and 2023 brings so much opportunity to help even more bright minds in New York City access the GO experience.

Learning gaps are closed when students access support early in the elementary years, receive personalized instruction in reading and math, and come back to GO year after year.

- GO helped students recalibrate to inperson learning in the 2021-22 school year and saw encouraging results: 60% of K-2 students moved one or more levels closer to the proficiency bar in reading and a third of all K-8 students demonstrated significant growth in math.
- Students not only beat the summer learning slide this July and August, but more than half - 53% - grew one month or more in both reading and math.
- GO expanded its ELA support, developing a Tier 2 literacy program for students in grades K-5 who have the most room to grow toward proficiency, with 85% of students outpacing expected grade level growth.





- With a new tool, Hello Insight, to measure progress,
 GO saw 80% of students experience growth in at least one SEL competency over the school year.
- Highest levels of growth included Academic Self-Efficacy – perceived mastery over learning and potential to gain academic success – and Social Skills – the ability to take other perspectives into account.
- Summer surveys revealed that **70% of students are** having positive youth development experiences, predictors to be on track for meaningful SEL gains.

SOCIAL EMOTIONAL LEARNING

GO invests equally in a young person's social emotional growth, using the Sanford Harmony curriculum in the classroom, targeted learning workshops, and summer enrichment activities to build confidence, empathy, respect, and motivation.









FAMILY SUPPORT

Parents and caregivers are the most important partners in GO's work. Our social work team grew in 2022 to include 5 Success Coaches and 9 multi-lingual Family Engagement Associates to help ease transitions back to school, advocate for children with special education classifications, guide families through the middle and high school choice process, and extend support to student alumni after the 8th grade.

- More than 500 families received case management support and resource referrals to meet basic needs including food security, housing stability, and mental health care.
- Nearly 45% of GO students have an Individualized Service Plan (IEP) due to learning disabilities or speech impairments, and their families received additional support to ensure that students had the tools and services they needed to succeed.
- GO reintroduced its in-person **family workshop series** this school year to offer discussions on topics like self-care, nutrition, self-defense, and how to talk to your child about diversity.
- Parents of rising 6th and 9th graders received counseling and application support to ensure access to high-performing middle and high schools, and GO introduced a new Alumni Workforce Initiative to give former GO students paid professional experience.





- 40 public schools that collaborate on student enrollment and progress and 5 independent host-site schools that provide program space and resource sharing, including Avenues, Berkeley Carroll School, Grace Church School, LREI, and St. Luke's School.
- **200 direct service staff members** from across the city, including Head Teachers, Teaching Assistants, Student Teachers, Reading Specialists, and Social Workers.



- **500** individual and corporate group volunteers, including Bank of India, Brookfield, Cerberus, DailyPay, Glenview, JPMorgan, LHi Group, McKinsey, and PwC.
- **30 nonprofit and higher education partners**, including NYU, Hunter, Bank Street, the Center for Attention & Learning, and the Promise Project.
